FROM THE EDITOR'S DESK.....

Traveling to the GCSAA Headquarters in Lawrence, Kansas, as a chapter delegate was a most enlightening experience. Before going along any further, I do want to express my thanks and appreciation to the Pocono Turfgrass Association for the opportunity. To represent the Association in what could have been the most pivotal meeting for National/Chapter relations is guite an honor. GCSAA would like all affiliated chapters to sign and abide by an updated affiliation agreement similar to the one the Association agreed to back in October 1970. The proposed changes, outlined in the last issue of Chips & Putts were discussed at The following list summarizes the length. recommended changes to the originally proposed affiliation agreement:

1. The Conference and Show privilege for executive directors should be removed from the agreement.

2. The affiliation fee of \$500 for new chapters should not be implemented until July 1, 1977.

3. Class A and B GCSAA members should make up a majority of the chapter's board and all of the chapter officers.

4. There should be a dual membership requirement in affiliated chapters and GCSAA starting July 1, 1997. Members who have joined before that date would be grandfathered into the Association.

In a nutshell, what does all this mean? It means that GCSAA is making a concerted effort to enforce the chapter affiliation agreement and to have strength in numbers. After my trip to GCSAA headquarters, I am convinced that there are no hidden agendas, it is not a ploy or a membership drive to generate revenues by GCSAA, and without question, the proposed affiliation agreement is a good thing. The PTGA can offer much more as an affiliated chapter than we can ever offer as a non-affiliated chapter.







CAREER DEVELOPMENT/PLACEMENT

JOB HUNTING TIPS

* Try to avoid time gaps in your resume. They raise questions in the mind of the one reviewing them and may prevent an interview from occurring.

* When considering a new position, always ask yourself, "How will this career move prepare me for the one to follow?"

* Once you've decided to apply for a position, your primary goal should be to receive the job offer. You can always refuse to accept it, especially if you've had apprehensions along the way.

* Ask references to send letters directly to the prospective employer, rather than you forwarding them. Letters sent directly to the interviewer (from the reference) are perceived to be more honest and objective.

DEVELOPING REFERENCE RELATIONSHIPS

It's important to develop a good relationship with your references before you begin seeking a position. References can open doors as well as close them if they aren't chosen well. Potential references must know your qualifications and be willing to write and speak on your behalf. Here are a few points to remember:

* Select references that have a good reputation and begin developing a good rapport with them.

* Keep references well informed of your achievements and qualifications.

* Ask references for their advice on how you can strengthen your career, having them point out weaknesses to correct.

* Try to obtain a balance of references that includes a cross-section of potential representatives.

- 3RD PLACE NORTHEASTERN GOLF COURSE SUPTS. ASSOC.




NEW PENN STATE DEPARTMENT HEAD IN AGRONOMY



Steven Fales, Professor of Crop Management, has been named Head of the Agronomy Department at Penn State University effective July 1, 1995. Dr. Fales replaces Al Turgeon, who stepped down last August to become Director of Distance Education in the Agricultural Sciences.

Dr. Fales teaches forage crops management and principles of crop production at Penn State. In addition, Fales will continue to serve as co-director of the Center for Pasture Research and Education, which was established in 1994, as a collaborative effort with the USDA Pasture Research Laboratory.

Dr. Fales earned a B.A. in English in 1969 and an M.S. in plants and soil science in 1977 from the University of Rhode Island. After completing a Ph.D. in agronomy from Purdue in 1980, University he worked as a postdoctoral fellow at the University of Georgia from 1980-82. He then was promoted to assistant professor with a research emphasis In 1985, he joined Penn on forage systems. State as an associate professor.
