GOOSE DAMAGE MANAGEMENT SYMPOSIUM SCHEDULED....

Damage to vegetation and habitat by our Canada Goose population is a serious concern to individuals responsible for design and management of golf courses, parks, commercial campuses, or other open spaces. An all day symposium is being held at Rutgers University on November 12, 1996. The program will include speakers from Federal, State, and Commercial organizations. Emphasis will be placed on migratory and non-migratory geese, and the development of effective strategies to reduce the conflict of geese, property, and people. Special emphasis will be placed on practical solutions.

The symposium is being jointly sponsored by the American Society of Landscape Architects (New Jersey Chapter), United States Department of Agriculture; Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service: Animal Damage Control (USDA; APHIS: ADC), and Rutgers University. Following is a copy of the Agenda:
