They provide a truly unbiased view of your course operation and the reputation of the USGA carries a lot of weight with most clubs. The FTGA is another valuable source of information. 

1997 Legislative Session Report by Mike Goldie

"As we approach the midway point of the 1997 Session, I have prepared a list of bills effecting our members.

WATER RESOURCES:

One of the most important issues and one which causes the most debate and disagreement is "minimal flows and levels" (MFLs). The term means the maximum sustainable usage of a water body or source which will still protect the environment, i.e., wildlife, etc. Who sets the MFLs, how are they set, and the impact of MFLs are the points of disagreement.

HB 715 Rep. Laurent:

· Addresses the establishment of MFL's, including requirements that DEP or WMDs develop strategy to aid in the recovery of water resources that have fallen below their MFL;

· Address WMD appointment, budgeting and personnel issues, including requirement that the Governor appoint the executive directs of each WMD;

· Specifies that WMDs are responsible for water resource development;

· Establishes criteria by which wateruse permits can be issued for up to 20 years and:

Promotes "Local Sources First".

HB 1321 Rep. Bitner:

· Specifies criteria for DEP/WMD establishment of MFLs, including a requirement that those agencies offset any advisers impact to existing permitted water users, or other legal users, due to adoption of an MFL prior to implementation.

· Declares that water resource development is the responsibility of the WMDs and water supply development is the responsibility of local governments, utilities, regional water supply authorities and special taxing districts; and

· Directs DEP/WMDs to offset any adverse impact to existing permitted water users, or other legal users, due to adoption of a reservation of waters, by developing and funding sufficient water supply, prior to implementing a reservation.

This is the "Coalition" Bill.

HB 1339 - Rep. Goode:

· Establishes linkages among the Florida Water Plan, District Water Management Plan, and Regional Water Supply Plans

· Specifies what constitutes water resource development and water supply development, and who is responsible for each:

 Addresses WMD budget submission to the Governor, and

 Directs Public Service Commission to presume as correct or prudent when determining rates those costs which a utility incurs in order to comply with DEP or WMD environmental permitting requirements.

This is the Governor's bill.

TAXES:

HB 209 - Rep. Ziebarth

This bill exempts sales tax on farm equipment over a three year period (turf farming.)
