# Seventh Annual Ridge Invitational

The Seventh Annual Ridge Invitational was held at the beautiful Grasslands GC in Lakeland which has been the host for this fundraiser since its inception in 1992. Host Roy Wilshire had the course in excellent condition.

Proceeds from the Invitational go to the FTGA, FGCSA and local Polk County charities. This year theraffle ticket sales were donated to the Red Cross Disaster Releaf Fund for victims of the tornadoes that hit Central Florida. The Ridge donated \$1,000 to the Red Cross.

Jim Torba of the University of South Florida Golf Course in Tampa won low gross honors and, as usual, the Ridge took the chapter championship!

#### Food Quality Protection Act Update

Some progress, but no victory yet, in the FQPA battle. Here's the latest news.

From the GCSAA Briefax dated April 9, 1998:

"Vice President Gore Issues Directive on FQPA"

"...I'm requesting that the EPA Administrator and the Secretary of Agriculture work together to ensure that implementation of the paramount public health goals of the new law is informed by a sound regulatory approach.

...EPA and USGA should provide an initial report to me on implementation of this memorandum within fourteen (14) days..."

In response to letters, calls and visits to the White House and Congress from those affected by the Food Quality Protection Act (FQPA), Vice President Al Gore yesterday issued a directive to EPA and USDA on proper implementation of the law.

The four-page memorandum to USDA Secretary Dan Glickman and EPA Administrator Carol Browner outlines a series of implementation principles. "In summary the principles require decisions based on science, communication and public input. Many of the principles address specific problems the regulated industry has been experiencing in trying to work with the EPA."

Communicate, disclose and explain. The directive says decisions should be transparent to affected constituencies and that the agency communicate in a manner that facilitates informed review.

**Discretion.** The directive reminds the EPA that it has discretion in applying elements of the law such as the 10X safety factor and addressing risks to children.

**Transition.** EPA is told to allow for transition, respond appropriately to emergency pest management problems, and be open to using a variety of approaches for reducing risk. The agency will be held to its word that pesticide registration cancellations will not affect this growing season.

Consultation. EPA and USDA are directed to establish a mechanism for getting advice and information from affected user groups, lawmakers, government agencies and the public.

"Announcement of the directive is an encouraging sign" reports RISE. "We are also encouraged about the Administration's call for broad stakeholder participation."

Don't stop those letters and calls! We're not out of the woods yet. Tell lawmakers that the situation warrants their continued attention. GCSAA will also continue to work with RISE and our industry allies to ensure representation of the golf course superintendents as specialty pesticide users in the implementation of FQPA.

### Government In The Dark Still Sheds Lots of Light

The Everglades Chapter had a different kind of educational session for their February meeting evening at Stonebridge Country Club. Mike Mongoven enlisted the aid of Mike Goldie, our Legislative Consultant, to ask several state and local law makers to attend the meeting. The agenda included an afternoon tour of Colliers Reserve by the legislators with host Tim Hiers followed by a question and answer program and dinner at Stonebridge CC.

State Senator Fred Dudley, who is running for Attorney General, was joined by State Representatives Joe Spratt; Burt Saunders; Mr. Steve St. Laurent for Representative Keith Arnold; Collier County Commissioner Tim Hancock and Lee County Commissioner John Albion on the legislative panel for the question and answer part of the program. Cynthia Kelly Smith from the GCSAA acted as moderator.

Spokespersons from leading golf organizations presented facts and posed questions to the lawmakers. FGCSA's Joe Ondo spoke about reuse water and asked the panel to look into the often inconsistent cost of "grey water" from course to course and county to county.

Ron Dodson of Audubon International urged the law makers to see golf courses as real positive land development projects and treat them in a less punitive manner when it comes to permitting. Make it

possible for people with smaller pocketbooks to still survive the permitting process to keep golf affordable for more people.

FTGA President David Barnes presented the case for equitable funding of turfgrass in the IFAS budget since the FTGA Economic Impact Survey has shown our industry is already equivalent or larger than other sector of Florida agriculture and horticulture. David wanted to know what else will it take to get more parity in funding.

Bill Baker of the Golf Course Owners Association talked about the impact of state and local legislation and tax assessments on smaller golf courses. He cited the Sarasota County Runoff Tax Assessment as an example of the type of uninformed law making that can put some courses out of business.

Bo White, President of the Club Managers Association, asked how the local governments might share the costs of education and day care for many of the bilingual work force which are now necessary due to the rapid growth in the area. The programs and costs are now being initiated and borne by individual clubs.

PGA Tour spokesman Carl Ogden talked about the new World Golf Hall of Fame and how much business and tourism it will generate.

Florida Golf Alliance President Ron Garl talked about the goals of the Alliance and the importance of bringing a consistent unified message to the lawmakers. He also told the lawmakers that the Alliance's first project will be to quantify the total economic impact of golf to the state's revenue.

It was obvious from comments from the lawmakers that they were

getting a lot of information about golf that they didn't know existed. To a man they praised the informal format of the gathering and suggested that these kinds of meetings continue.

Without a doubt the most enlightening exchanges occurred with the two County Commissioners Hancock and Albion. Not only did the commissioners have questions, they had some answers and suggestions. It made those in attendance aware that while we have usually aimed our energies at Tallahassee, we also need to work on those local relationships equally as well.

The sun might have set during the meeting, but there was a new dawn in government relations.

·Government Relations. The grass roots letter writing campaign for the Food Quality Protection Act has been a major focus the past month and continues as each chapter was sent a Congressional Contact Kit. contained the latest information from the GCSAA on progress or lack of it with EPA in Washington and the addresses of all of Florida's senators and congressmen. On behalf of the FGCSA, I have written two sets of letters to all Representatives and Senators detailing the need for EPA to be responsive to real data and real risk. In the second round of letters I also wrote the Vice President as suggested by the GCSAA. Each chapter needs to follow up with the materials provided and send letters to President Clinton, Vice President Gore and both Florida Senators and your Congressional District Representative. This issue will not go away and we must voice our concern now or risk losing the use of some of our most effective insecticides and fungicides. Write those letters now! See the GCSAA report on the FOPA in this Green Sheet.

·Chapter Relations.
