Dennis Houle enjoys a happy homecoming as superintendent at historic Winchester C.C.

Even now, in the cold and the drizzle and the miserable dampness of spring, these are good days for Dennis Houle.

The homecoming, after all, provides a built-in blanket of warmth, and the



intangibles that come with it are enough to keep him happy.

For instance?

"Now, I can turn on my TV and root for the Red Sox and not have to watch the Yankees. For 17 years, my favorite team was whoever was playing the Yankees."

Houle, you see, has returned to his native Massachusetts, albeit at the other end of the state. Born and raised in Chicopee - the "home of the world's longest kielbasa," he'll proudly tell you - the 40-year-old Houle accepted the superintendent's position at stately Winchester Country Club late last fall and if you bump into him and see him smiling, it's because so much has fallen into place for him.

"It's a great golf course. It's just phenomenal to have this opportunity," said Houle. "To get the chance to work on a [Donald] Ross course? I'm thrilled."

Just don't get the idea that he was scanning the industry newsletter, searching madly for such an opening. He wasn't. Except for that dreaded influence of Yankee propaganda in the Nutmea State, Houle for 17 years was settled in nicely at a series of Connecticut golf clubs.

There were a few years as an assistant at Brooklawn Country Club in Fairfield. then two years as superintendent at one of the grand layouts in New England, Yale University Golf Club in New Haven. It's a Charles Blair Macdonald-Seth Raynor design that is saturated in an unmistakable aura.

"Rees Jones was on the selection committee when I got hired at Yale," said Houle, and there is irony in that because the next move took him to Redding Country Club in Redding. That's one of the first golf courses you'll find on Jones's resume and it's where Houle was very happy for 10 years.

The only thing is, the chance to work at Winchester was too good an opportunity to pass up. Yes, because it's one of Ross's great pieces of work, but also because not only is Houle a Bay State native, so, too, is wife Cindy.

"She's from Chelmsford and has relatives in Somerville," said Houle. "She lived in Newton at one time and we always said we'd like to get back. It was a goal of both of ours."

Of course, life is different than it was when Dennis and Cindy first headed to Connecticut, back in those years just after he graduated from the Stockbridge school (1983) and the University of Massachusetts (1985), and right after he did a year's internship at Springfield Country

For one thing, "I took her to Connecticut with no children and I brought her back with three." Their names are Maggie, 6; Kate, 5; and Jack, 3.

While Houle was at Brooklawn, it hosted the US Senior Open (Gary Player won) and while at New Haven, there were a couple of stops by what was then called the Nike Tour. So he's been around courses held in high esteem,

making it a comfortable fit at Winchester. Founded in 1902, Winchester's history is rich and storied, from its famous Father-Son Tournament, to a list of winners there, names such as Francis Ouimet (1919 State Amateur), Glenna Collett (1921 women's State Amateur), Fred Wright (1931 State Amateur), Jim Browning (1965 State Open), Dana Quigley (1985 NEPGA), and Fran Quinn Jr. (1986 State Amateur). Legendary men such as Harold "Jugs" McSpaden and J.L. "Tex" McReynolds have had significant stints as head professional there.

In other words, it's a club with heritage and great substance, and Houle feels fortunate to have returned to Massachusetts with such a position, though the realities of the job go beyond the nostalgia. Though he's still learning the quickest route "to the clubhouse," Houle is prepared for what Mother Nature has for him.

The winter was cold, but not entirely brutal, "except that our poa took a beating," said Houle, who inherits a classic golf course, but also the daily problems that are common in the industry.

"There is no such thing as status quo at a golf course. Everyone in the business knows that."

Like virtually every other golf club in the country, Winchester is dealing with projects. Right now, it's a water supply issue and eventually there'll be the need to go to work on the irrigation system. But of more immediate concern is the transformation from winter to spring and Houle knows what that means in New England, Winchester not being that much different that Redding.

"We've overseeded," he said, "but we need someone to turn on the heat a little. We want to start. People are anxious. Me, too." 🛎

Unanimous vote of GCSANE board determines breech of ethics code

As a result of James Reinertson's conviction on four counts of larceny against

Course Superintendent's Association of New England has voted unanimously that a breech of our code of ethics has occurred. Specifically, Article III, Section 1, which states "a member shall be deemed to have violated the code by: acting and speaking in a manner which would cause discredit to our profession and Association" has been breeched.

Based on this breech, the board has also voted unanimously to proceed with the expulsion of Mr. Reinertson without prejudice on May 25, 2004 as outlined in our bylaws under Article IV, Section 14.

Beginning in fall 2004, GCSANE will record education points online & service points via code

GCSAA-affiliated chapters now have the ability to record education points and service points online for their members. If your chapter chooses this option, you will need to designate one individual to record the points for your members.

(GCSANE Executive Secretary Sharon Brownell will begin recording education

points in the fall, and for now a code will be given at the meetings for service points.)

Through the new tool, your chapter's representative will be able to:

• Register a chapter meeting. Chapter meetings that have not been pre-approved for education points will earn attendees .10 service points.

What if our chapter chooses not to record points for members? If your chapter decides not to record service points for its members, your chapter's representative will still need to register the meeting. Please provide your members with the chapter meeting code and

instruct them to complete the online service point affidavit to receive credit.

For all chapter meetings after June 1, your chapter's members will be responsible for entering the code on the service point affidavit. If your members still need to record points for events that occurred prior to June 1, they can submit the

service point affidavit for meetings in which a code was not required. They will be directed to a special form to submit points for those past events.

• Note: Your chapter can apply for education points through the chapter administrative tool. If your chapter has a meeting eligible for education points, or is hosting some kind of education event (separate from a chapter meeting) then your chapter's representative must complete a chapter external education application. This process has not changed, but the application form is now available online and we have added a link to the online application for your convenience.

Upon receipt of the application and supplemental information, GCSAA staff will review the information and, if the program meets the criteria, education points will be awarded. Your chapter representative will be sent an approval code notice with the event approval code. This notice should be distributed to attendees for their records.

If your chapter elects not to record education points, please provide members a copy of the approval code notice and instruct them to complete the online education point affidavit to receive credit.

• Recording attendance. This is strictly voluntary. If your chapter chooses to provide this service, your chapter representative will log on to the chapter administrative tool and select either the continued on page 9

The points, service or education, will automatically post to each member's record and transcript. Members can access their transcript to verify points were recorded.

Weevils are on the move, reports Dr. Vittum of UMass: An update on Annual Bluegrass (Hyperodes) Weevil

By Dr. Pat Vittum, Dept. of Entomology, UMass

Hyperodes weevils (a.k.a. annual bluegrass weevils) are causing headaches for golf course superintendents up and down the Atlantic seaboard, and even into western Pennsylvania. We have had reports (unconfirmed but numerous!) of

weevil damage in the Philadelphia area, south Jersey, and West Virginia, as well as

western Pennsylvania and many loca-

tions in New England.

We just analyzed samples from Westchester County, N.Y., earlier today. Samples were taken from plots that had about 150 larvae per square foot last week, and the larvae had been evenly distributed at that time - small, medium, and large larvae. I had expected to see a lot of pupae in today's samples, but was surprised to continue to see lots of small larvae, along with mediumsized larvae and large larvae. There were a few pupae, but not as many as I had expected.

Here's what I think is going on: First of all, something about the conditions this past winter and early spring was very favorable for weevil survival, so populations are higher than we have seen in a long time — at least in many locations. Obviously, the adults survived the winter very well.

The spring temperatures were variable, with stretches of warm weather followed by cooler conditions. It appears that some adults got an early start and began laying eggs about "on schedule," while others were delayed. As a result, we had a very extended period of egglaying in most locations. This means we are already finding all sizes of larvae and pupae in the same site. While we often see overlap later in the season, it is a little unusual to see such a spread this early in the summer.

The practical implication of this spread of development is that it will be very difficult to figure out the most efficient way to control weevils this year. It will be more important than ever to scout the property and know what stages you have in a given area. Larvae look like grains of rice with brown heads. Pupae are cream colored and sort of diamondshaped, and you can see the wings developing on the back. Collect turf cores and tease apart the turf by hand,


