Garland Golf Course is owned by Garland Manufacturing Co. and was built about 26 years ago by Mr. Herman Otto, President and owner of Garland with Mr. Ossie Pynnonen, as superintendent. This was a private golf course at that time and had only nine holes. Assisting in the building of the original nine and still there is "Bud" Cahoon, one of our memebrs. In 1972, the back nine holes were started under the direction of the present Superintendent, Nile "Snuffy" Bunting and opened June 1st, 1973.
