## Golf and Meeting at McGuire's Resort July 6th. Greg Lyman, Guest Speaker

M.S.U. Environmental Specialist Greg Lyman will be the guest speaker at our July 6th meeting. He will address the current regulatory issues facing our industry, and will be available for questions. You won't want to miss this event.

Dave Pretznaw is the host superintendent at McGuire's Resort in Cadillac where we will enjoy golf following lunch and the meeting. Bill Snyder is the Golf Professional.

McGuire's Resort started out during the 1950's as a 9 hole course design first by Bruce Matthews, Sr. It was then redesigned into into an 18 hole course by Curly and Jim McGuire, and finally to a 27 hole complex in the mid 70's. The back nine of the Spruce Course received a face lift in the mid 80's with three new holes, much mounding and rough irrigation. A new Par 3, and a renovation of the existing #5 Par 3 on the Spruce Course, are scheduled to begin during the fall of 1993. McGuire's Resort started out as, and still remains a family owned and operated business for more than 40 years.

The day will begin with an 11:00 a.m. luncheon at McGuire's Main Lodge in the Cadillac Room. Lunch will be a deli buffet. Greg Lyman will then speak to us, and golf will follow with 1:30 shotgun start (game and contests to be determined).

McGuire's Resort is located on the south end of Cadillac, on Mackinaw Trail, between 131 and 115. The Cadillac Room is located at the main lodge, the Pro-Shop is located toward the rear of the facility and can be reached by driving through the main parking lot following the directional sign.

## Special GCSAA S&R grants offered to graduate students

Outstanding graduate students in the field of golf course management education and research now have a new grant program available to them.

The Golf Course Superintendents Association of America (GCSAA) Graduate Student Grants Program will provide annual awards of \$5,000 to individuals pursuing advanced degrees in academic fields related to golf course management.

The goal of the program, sponsored by the GCSAA Scholarship and Research (S&R) Foundation, is to identify and encourage tomorrow's leading educators and researchers.

To be eligible, students must be currently enrolled in a master's or doctorate degree program related to golf course management. Students must also plan to pursue an academic career in a university setting.

Applicants will be evaluated on academic excellence, potential to make outstanding contributions in research and education, peer recommendations and previous accomplishments in their field. In addition to the cash award, winners will receive an expenses-paid trip to the GCSAA International Golf Course Conference and Show.

The deadline for application is October 1. Awards will be presented in early February. Application forms are available from the GCSAA development department - 913-841-2240.
