Happiness is Shoveling Snow

Not to sound negative, but this white stuff is killing me!

Down state friends are always envious of my living up north. They wonder what I do with my free time: skiing, snowmobiling, ice fishing perhaps? Nope, for six months I move snow from point A, to point B.

When I first moved up north, I actually liked the idea of becoming an expert with the snow blower and plow truck. By the end of the first winter this somewhat romantic vision of the northern Michigan working class hero was rapidly fading.

I know he's just doing his job, but I'm beginning to think of him as the enemy.

All this gets me thinking about spring and number thirteen green, where the deepest snow in all of Antrim County is currently waiting. I should save some strength for shoveling that baby!





Farmers Almanac Forecast for the Great Lakes
