"professional development." Organizations have learned that investing in their workers by helping them attend classes, conferences, and other training events, will greatly benefit their corporation and help them accomplish their goals.

It is unfortunate for those who weren't able to attend because of "being too busy, forgetfulness, slothfulness, or not wanting to drive the seven plus hours" because you missed great opportunities to learn, ask questions, meet old friends, and the list goes on and on.

As I prepare myself for another eighteen hole construction project, it appears there are more questions than answers to remedy them. One of these areas of question is in what type of greens construction to use. There are plenty to pick from, from the USGA approved construction method to everything else in between to the push up green. One thing I have noticed as I have played other courses this summer with high sand content greens, is the plague of algae and moss. I battle this myself on a continuing basis with the greens with a high sand content. A plus for me in attending the Field Day was getting to speak with Bob Vavrek Jr. from the USGA Green Section and Phil Dwyer Jr. from M.S.U. about this problem. Both gentlemen gave me new insight as to the causal agents of algae and moss, of which I plan on following up on. If either of these ideas pan out, I will let you know in the months ahead.

Dr. Kevin Frank gave a presentation on water movement in a sloped green. The problems addressed here were to try and remedy localized dry spots (LDS) and black layer; commonly seen on USGA greens. Specifications for the rootzone mix of USGA greens require the sand mix to be placed at a uniform depth of 12" across the entire surface of the green. On a flat green this works very well, however, in reality only a few of us have them. Most of us have greens ranging from slight to extremely sloping greens which causes high areas to become dry and low areas to become saturated, potentially leading to turfgrass decline. At the Hancock Turfgrass Research Center the traditional 12" soil mix is used as well as a modified method which incorporates 16" of soil mix on low areas and 8" over the peaks (high) areas of the green. Different rootzone materials are used as well: sand, sand/ peat mix, and sand/soil mix). One thing I noticed was less evidence of dollar spot on the sand/ soil mix than on the 100% sand or the sand/peat mix.

At another stop Joe Vargas Jr. and Phil Dwyer Jr. spoke about dollar spot (Sclerotinia homeocarpa) management using reduced fungicide inputs. Even though I have been fairly consistent in using this approach for the past twelve years, there was still more to learn. Our poa fairways used to get "hammered" in late July - early September. Dr. Vargas paid me a visit in the late 80's and told me to get on a program of using chlorothalonil at a greatly reduced rate but on a

regular schedule. So, every year, depending on weather conditions conducive for Sclerotinia development, we spray 1 oz. chlorothalonil/1000 ft. sq. and repeat every 10 days. Sometimes it just doesn't work out for us to spray that often, BUT when we do the results are nice . . .green turf and no mycelium from Sclerotinia.

Tom Nikolai gave an interesting discussion on the historical and current fertilizer management practices for golf course greens. In 1964 Dr. James Beard of M.S.U. released three suggested fertilization programs for golf course greens. His "Intensive Fertilization" programs suggested 8.5 lbs. N/1000 sq.ft. annually while his "Los Budget Greens Program" suggested a mere 4.25 lbs. N/1000 sq.ft. annually. We have come a long way since 1964!

If you are like me, you most likely find yourself at that lower figure. This year I tried going with all liquid fertilizer with the exception of a dormant IBDU application in the fall and a granular applied during late spring. As I write this (August 29) I am here to inform you that I got hit pretty hard on my greens with dollar spot, something that I fortunately haven't experienced in many years! The important thing to note here is not to only use granular or only use liquids but to experiment, try new things, even if it is only on a part of your nursery. Meet with your bosses and let them know of the benefits of these types of experiments on your own turf. Will it take extra time and record keeping? Yes. But it will also
