

NMTMA Recycle Recap 2005

The 2005 NMTMA recycle program continues to be a successful program with many golf courses contributing to the program. This year NMTMA teamed up with Turfgrass Inc. for a season long collection of containers. Turfgrass Inc. helped with the project by providing a year-round storage for the containers and provided the service of picking up clean and empty containers throughout the year. According to early calculations we will have met or surpassed the goal of the project.

In November a meeting was held at Treetops Resort that recapped the recycle program. Around 65 people attended and learned legislative and state issues on recycling in Michigan, resistance management, tank mixing strategies, modes of action of products, calibration of sprayers, nozzle selection and leaf coverage. Due to the positive response of the talks, the NMTMA board would like to try and cover these topics more in depth at the Mini–Conference.
