President's Message

Association Contributors and Contributions

ith the season's end drawing near, we all have some time to think beyond how we can improve our courses and look toward what we can do to strengthen our association. At our last board meeting, we reviewed some of the comments and concerns voiced by past board members and the general membership and tried to develop ways to better our association for the future.

In all the points raised, it became clear that our association could profit from more operating capital. Our dues have remained the same since 1989, while the cost of running our association has grown every year. Our many expenses would be too long—and tedious—to list here, but among those expenditures most important to our membership are:

- Providing support to outside research and educational pursuits, such as the Tri-State Turf Research Foundation, the GCSAA Foundation, and Dr. Rossi's moss research—to name only several.
- Growing our scholarship fund to accommodate rising college costs and the growing number of children who will become eligible to seek a scholarship. Our goal is to build up enough of a reserve in our fund to cover scholarships with interest (continued on page 2)

Charlie Robson Honored With 1998 John Reid Lifetime Achievement Award

MetGCSA VP John Carlone Offers an Inside Look at Met PGA Section Executive Director Charlie Robson and His Award-Worthy Accomplishments

hen Charles (Charlie) Leonard Robson signed on as the Metropolitan PGA Section's Executive Director, it was a lucky day not only for the Met PGA, but also the Met GCSA. While guiding the Met PGA for more than a quarter century, Charlie has touched us all with his humor, fairness, patience, and concern for not only the game of golf, but also those involved in making golf a better game—not the least of whom is the golf course superintendent.

Says MetGCSA Awards Committee Chairman John O'Keefe: "Charlie has always been a tremendous advocate of golf course superintendents—and their role in the game of golf. He's never forgotten to recognize the superintendent's efforts."

For this reason—and so many others
—the MetGCSA voted unanimously to
present its coveted John Reid Lifetime
Achievement Award to Charlie Robson
—an award reserved for individuals who



golf. "Golf has been the common language spoken in my life for over a quarter century," he says. "And it's the bond that I've shared with so many people. I am truly honored to receive the John Reid Lifetime Achievement Award from the MetGCSA."

A Manhasset native, Robson resides in Garden City with his wife, Deidre, and children, Matthew, 17; Brita, 13; and Colleen, 11.

The Reid Award's Roots

Initiated in 1986, the John Reid Lifetime Achievement Award was named after the man affectionately known as the "Father of American Golf." John Reid was not only the first to play golf in this country (in 1888), he was also instrumental in forming the first golf club at St. Andrews and, later, the USGA and the MGA.

But probably even more important to superintendents is that John Reid, by

recognizing that golf courses required daily maintenance and care, was, in large part responsible for establishing the golf course management profession.

Beware of the Tinnest of Insects





wo months ago, one of the most caring people I know put the fear of life-or perhaps death—into me after catching a glimpse of a coffee-saucer-sized rash on my left wrist. Heritage Hills of Westchester Superintendent Todd Polidor filled me in on the plight of a fellow employee who ignored symptoms similar to mine and spent a month in the hospital before his condition was cured.

That's all I needed to hear before going to get checked out. The verdict? You guessed it: Lyme Disease.

Lyme Disease has been publicly know for about 15 years now. Strides have been made to control it, but more work is imperative. It is more conclusive to test the biting tick than the victim's blood for the dreaded antagonist called spirochete.

The antibiotic I was put on required three weeks of internal use. It made my skin highly susceptible to sunburn and prevented me from even a taste of a summer "cold one"—just one of the numerous drawbacks to getting the disease.

All kidding aside, though, Lyme Disease is nothing to take lightly—especially after a mild winter like the one we had, which allowed the ticks to thrive. Fall is no time to let down your guard. Be sure to use tick repellents, insecticide sprays in overgrowth areas, and check yourself carefully after being in wooded or grassy areas. More important, should you feel persistent fatigue and aches, get tested. It's something to take seriously. Ask Waccabuc Superintendent Eddie Binsse, who is still dealing with the disease's effects.




